About the Award

The Graduating Class Awards for Excellence in Teaching are awarded annually on behalf of each graduating class to instructors in each engineering department who best exemplify the following characteristics:

- Motivated students to learn
- Demonstrated outstanding teaching skills
- Adopted appropriate and effective teaching techniques
- Facilitated student learning positively and invited open classroom discussion
- Communicated effectively with students and was approachable outside of class
- Assessed student performance consistently, fairly, and in a timely manner
- Provided organized course materials and clear instructions
- Recognized the diversity of academic interests of students
- Maintained an atmosphere of collegiality and respect in the classroom

Eligibility

This award is open to all faculty members and instructors who hold an appointment in the Faculty of Engineering or are responsible for teaching undergraduate engineering courses. Past recipients of the award are not eligible for a period of three years from the date of their award. A list of past recipients can be found at umanitoba.ca/engineering.

Award Categories

There are five categories for the award, and there will be one award in each category every year. The categories are:

- 1. The Graduating Class Award for Excellence in Teaching Biosystems Engineering
- 2. The Graduating Class Award for Excellence in Teaching Civil Engineering
- 3. The Graduating Class Award for Excellence in Teaching Electrical and Computer Engineering
- 4. The Graduating Class Award for Excellence in Teaching Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering
- 5. The Graduating Class Award for Excellence in Teaching Common Courses in Engineering
